Dear Brothers and Sisters,

How a person copes with pressures and disappointments can differ markedly. Some respond positively and can still see each new day as a fresh opportunity. Others however are just so overwhelmed that each day is a constant battle just to get through. For them everything is negative.

It has been my experience that those with faith in God fare much better when the going gets tough. It is during the dark hours, the sad moments of life that many begin to feel the presence of God supporting and uplifting them. It's when things just don't seem to be going right that they begin to feel the power of God right alongside them as Comforter, Sustainer, Guide and Friend. It is an awesome experience and one that gives people much needed renewed strength and purpose.

Many today, including some frequent churchgoers, struggle to find God. For them God is a remote figure. The development of an active prayer life, let alone a spiritual life, seems impossible. That doesn't surprise me, especially after they tell me just how jampacked and crowded-out their life has become.

Many spend each day literally racing from one event to the next with noise, stress and hassle at every turn. There's hardly a moment to just 'be' - and certainly never enough time to get in touch with one's inner self.

If you are struggling to find God in your prayer/spiritual life then I encourage you to cultivate and treasure the art of being still. If you work at it, especially regularly, the presence of the Comforter, the Holy One will draw near to sustain and strengthen you, just as our Lord promised. I have no doubt about that.

When visiting a Christian hospital in Hong Kong recently, I was pleased to see a rack of prayer cards at the entrance of the chapel. Prayer cards are useful, especially during a time of special need or concern for a loved one or myself. One particular card stood out that day. On the front was an image of a stunning Alpine landscape at sunrise and a verse from Psalm 46 - Be still and know that I am God. I must have read (and sung) those words hundreds of times before, but on that day, in that little chapel, with its numinous atmosphere, they really spoke to me. They reminded me yet again of the importance of being still in the presence of the Lord.

On Sunday 15th May the Church will celebrate the Feast of Pentecost - the annual commemoration of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Church and the coming of the Spirit of God upon the apostles and upon all Christian people. The Holy Spirit is the giver of courage and strength - a Divine power cleansing our thoughts, enlightening our understanding, ennobling our ideals, and guiding us in our anxieties. He is the Lord and Life-Giver, Helper and Divine Friend, the Eternal Spirit of the Eternal Saviour, who is God Eternal.

At the start of our ministry together on Pentecost Sunday, my prayer is that the Holy Spirit will fill all our hearts and kindle in us the fire of God's amazing life-giving love. Let us be the Good News of Jesus Christ.
